BACKGROUND

2022 has been mixed for the business environment, with recovery witnessed in some sectors, but the border bottleneck and zero-COVID policy in China and emerging geopolitical challenges have brought additional issues to the country. Mongolia is facing shrinking foreign exchange reserves, a skyrocketing inflation rate, and limited foreign investments. Nevertheless, with the reopening of the economy in the post-COVID context, AmCham Mongolia rolled out full-scale activities, organizing numerous events, vigorously engaging with stakeholders, undertaking focused policy advocacy efforts, representing the interests of members, and advocating for the organization's values: promotion of a private sector-led economy, the free market, and free enterprise in Mongolia.

A couple of highlights of our innovative initiatives include: organizing the first-ever in-country Doorknock, engaging with government stakeholders and presenting the Three Pillars for Positive Change policy statement; hosting ICT Week, bringing global digital businesses to the country; undertaking a popular tree planting corporate social responsibility initiative with the participation of around 100 volunteers; and upscaling AmCham's communications strategy and media exposure.



POLICY AND ADVOCACY

In 2022, AmCham Mongolia continued vigorous policy advocacy efforts and engagements with the government, representing the membership's interests and abiding by the organization's mandate of advocating for an enabling business environment and promoting the country as a place for global investments.

AmCham Roadmap 2022

AmCham Roadmap 2022 served as a guiding strategic framework for all AmCham policy initiatives throughout the year. The themes and speakers for the year's Monthly Meetings were closely aligned with the three key priorities outlined in the AmCham Roadmap 2022:

- a. Supporting private sector-led economic recovery and growth in Mongolia.
- b. Promoting U.S.-Mongolia bilateral trade and investment and regional connectivity.
- c. Tailoring support for our members' interests and elevating their brand recognition.

High-level policy and advocacy engagements

Mongolia Doorknock 2022

On June 21-23, AmCham Mongolia organized the first ever in-country Doorknock, engaging with Mongolian policymakers and senior government officials to reiterate policy messages promoting private sector-led economic growth.

During the Doorknock, AmCham Mongolia conveyed its key policy messages to policymakers concerning the Three Pillars for Positive Change:

1. Realigning toward a free-market economy driven by private sector entrepreneurs and enterprises
2. Reforming the business and investment environment
3. Prioritizing greater commerce and trade integration with the U.S. and third neighbors

AmCham's Doorknock delegation engaged with numerous high-level state officials: the Speaker of the Parliament, members of Parliament, deputy ministers of various ministries, and advisers to the President and Prime Minister. AmCham Mongolia's Doorknock 2022 set a new precedent for an effective engagement platform for constructive dialogue with critical stakeholders on improving the business and investment environment and promoting private sector-led economic development in Mongolia.



Roundtable on launching direct flights to the United States

AmCham Mongolia and the U.S. Embassy in Mongolia co-organized a roundtable on launching direct flights to the United States. The roundtable was a frank and constructive dialogue between the concerned parties discussing legal, safety, technical, and capacity issues. The roundtable resulted in expedited negotiations between the two countries on the Open Sky policy, advancing this exciting and ambitious initiative to launch direct flights between the two countries.



Panel discussion on the investment climate

The August Monthly Meeting featured the launch of the 2022 Investment Climate Statement (2022 ICS) issued by the U.S. State Department, highlighting some key challenges and opportunities in the business environment. Attention was paid to the amended Labor Law, which has caused major setbacks for employers. Some discussion points included:

Improving the FDI environment is essential to unlocking Mongolia's great potential to draw in investment.

- Laws not only need to be written but also implemented. The application of the rule of law, law enforcement, and the justice system should be thoroughly examined and developed for the investment legal framework.
- Revisions to the Law on Investment should address the lack of enforcement and cohesion with other laws, including the Tax Law.

Mining Week 2022

The Ministry of Mining and Heavy Industry hosted Mining Week, an innovative platform bringing together all mining-related forums and expos for a week-long event to enable broad participation and focused discussions on this critical sector. On the second day of Mining Week, AmCham Mongolia organized the panel discussion "Who Killed Mine-golia?" The panel included prominent private sector industry representatives. The topic and discussions resonated in the business community and were a highlight of the day. The discussion opened with a presentation providing a detailed breakdown of how Mine-golia devolved to its current state. AmCham Chairman Jay Liotta emphasized several key takeaways from his presentation, including that a series of legislative reforms, corruption at various levels of government, and judiciary incompetence, among other factors, have all contributed to the industry's demise. In his closing remarks, Mr. Liotta noted, "A well-developed legislative ecosystem based on private sector-led economic development in a free-market economy and curbing corruption are the tools for reviving investment in Mongolia."



AmCham Committees

Under the leadership of dedicated committee chairs, AmCham's Committees functioned as effective mechanisms for gaining broad support and acknowledgment from the wider business community. AmCham Committees held meetings in hybrid (virtual and in-person) formats and discussed specific policy actions:

ICT and Digital Economy Committee

The ICT and Digital Economy Committee, led by Gerelmaa B. (Steppe Group), organized a major international forum in June, Web 3.0: What's next? The conference was a unique platform for learning from representatives of top global tech companies, such as Polygon, Chainalysis, and DLA Piper, and a great opportunity for Mongolian companies to present projects and proposals. As policy advocates for the private sector, AmCham's ICT and Digital Economy Committee organized the event to discuss emerging technologies in different sectors, how policy and regulations have been responding to new digital economy data, and the use of new technology in Mongolia. The panel also addressed the policy framework and support that can be given to nurture new sectors and how to encourage direct investment by handling domestic and cross-border data flow soundly. Mongolia's key strengths and scalable sectors were identified, and how we can create a nurturing ecosystem for tech industry growth.



Agriculture Committee

On October 13, the Agriculture Committee, led by Mathew Metz (MSM Group), hosted a virtual meeting with Chase McGrath, the U.S. Department of Agriculture representative in Beijing. The committee members received a detailed update on the USDA's financing programs and discussed ways to partner with the USDA to competitively develop Mongolia's agriculture sector. The USDA offers three financing programs and detailed information will be provided.

Financial Services Committee

The Financial Services Committee, led by B. Munkhjin (EY), held several high-level meetings with the IMF Resident Representative, the Deputy Governor of the Bank of Mongolia, and other senior officials. A range of challenging issues related to foreign reserves, the balance of payments, banking reform, and ways forward were discussed to contribute to creating a sound banking and financial sector.



CSR Committee

The CSR Committee led an exciting and new initiative to plant trees with the active participation of around 100 membership representatives. The Committee also decided to hold AmCham's CSR Awards Ceremony at AmCham's 11th Anniversary Gala, celebrating the corporate social responsibility efforts of AmCham members.



Trade and Investment Committee

The key milestone of the Committee's efforts was the development of AmCham's position paper on Mongolia's trade and investment policy, which was presented to the government. The Committee also discussed issues related to the border bottleneck and the excessively delayed process of amending the Investment Law.



Mining and Heavy Industry Committee:

One of the Committee's important deliverables was drafting consolidated comments on tax-related legislation submitted with other business associations. Active participation in Mining Week was another successful Committee outcome. Amendments to the Minerals Law are still pending, and the Committee will lead the business community consultation process as soon as the process kicks off.



Auto and Machinery Committee

: On October 18, AmCham Mongolia's Auto and Machinery Committee, co-led by Craig Wright and Sean Murphy (Wearnes-StarChase), organized the roundtable Consolidating Efforts to Reduce Traffic Congestion in collaboration with the National Committee on Ulaanbaatar Traffic Congestion Reduction, the Ulaanbaatar Mayor's Office, and the Mongolian Automotive Distributors Association (MADA). For the last few years, AmCham Mongolia has consistently advocated for bold measures to deal with the influx of very old cars, gradually banning the import of RHD vehicles and imposing heavier taxes on very old cars. During the roundtable, AmCham shared some global best practices and experiences in dealing with the issue of traffic congestion. Minister J. Sukhbaatar stated that his policy would support limiting RHD vehicles by increasing taxes on old and RHD vehicles.



A few policy documents were developed based on extensive analysis and engagements. They were presented to government stakeholders, and follow-up actions were taken to bring about policy change:

2022 Roadmap for a Private Sector-led Economy – Outlines the three key priorities of AmCham Mongolia’s policy and advocacy.

Mongolia’s Trade and Investment Policy – Covers the government’s policy framework to attract and retain foreign direct investment (FDI), including Vision 2050 and the New Revival Policy, focusing on Mongolia’s need to increase FDI from its third neighbors.

Shaping the Future of the Digital Economy: Web 3.0 – The challenges and recommendations in this position paper were developed with input from many tech industry experts from leading international and domestic companies concerning issues raised and discussed during the June Monthly Meeting, Shaping the Future of the Digital Economy.

Consolidating Efforts to Reduce Traffic Congestion – Covers global best practices and policy recommendations, including increasing taxes for old cars to reduce traffic congestion in Ulaanbaatar, which were developed in collaboration with concerned stakeholders during AmCham’s Consolidating Efforts to Reduce Traffic Congestion roundtable.



Advocacy on key draft legislation

In 2022, AmCham Mongolia took policy and advocacy action on key legislation:

Labor Law: On March 10, AmCham Mongolia hosted then Minister of Labor and Social Protection A. Ariunzaya to discuss critical issues in labor relations and pension reform faced by the business community following the adoption of amendments to the Labor Law. During a Q&A session, AmCham members and businesses asked questions about various labor-related issues, requesting clarity on the issue of determining overtime pay and other wage bonuses based on salary averages instead of base salaries, which significantly increases wage costs for employers. Minister A. Ariunzaya agreed that the changes created significant financial burdens for employers and that they would be resolved as soon as possible by amending regulations for determining base salaries. On March 17, Minister A. Ariunzaya issued an order to amend regulations for determining base salaries, which became effective on April 1, 2022, thanks to AmCham's active policy and advocacy efforts.

Investment Law: AmCham Mongolia actively participated in a public consultation organized by the Ministry of Justice and Home Affairs on improving the legal environment for foreign direct investment. Deputy Minister of Justice and Home Affairs B. Solongoo stated that the English version of proposed amendments to the Investment Law is being finalized and that public consultations will be organized soon. AmCham Mongolia reiterated its offer to co-host a public-private dialogue on the amendments and emphasized the importance of feedback from various stakeholders. Extensive resources and time are devoted by businesses to provide meaningful comments on proposed legislation, which legislators often ignore. AmCham also highlighted the need to take immediate and effective action to re-launch the Investment Protection Council, perhaps under the Justice Minister or Minister of Economy and Development, rather than waiting for legislation to be approved.

Law on PPP: On October 24, a consultation on the public-private partnership (PPP) bill was organized. During the consultation, Ministry of Finance representative and head of the bill's sub-working group MP D. Unurbolor shared detailed information about the bill. AmCham Mongolia actively participated in the consultation and stated that the PPP bill needs to meet the following criteria:

- The state's role must be a regulator, not a competitor. Therefore, the PPP bill needs to encourage the development and feasibility of private sector projects and a private sector-led economy.
- Transparency in the selection process is required to prevent conflicts of interest and political influence.
- Mechanisms of accountability and guarantee are required if a private sector entity is not paid after they complete a project using their own financial resources and facing risk. How will the state ensure debts are paid to the private sector?
- The tendering and concession processes should be digitalized and published for the public.
- Ensure fair competition and no favoritism when the private sector competes against state-owned entities for PPP projects.

On October 18, AmCham Mongolia, in collaboration with other chambers, submitted its comments and feedback on the bill to Parliament's Economic Standing Committee, the Prime Minister, the Ministry of Economy and Development, and the Ministry of Finance.

Tax policy issues harmful for investments:

- On October 13, the business chambers including BCM, MNCCI, UB City Chamber of Commerce, AmCham Mongolia and Mongolian National Mining Association sent joint-letter along with the tax proposals concerning key harmful tax policy issues stopping investments.
- These tax proposals were sent to the Parliament Secretariat, Fiscal and Economic Standing Committees, Cabinet Secretariat, Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Justice and Home Affairs, Ministry of Mining and Heavy Industry.
- The tax proposals included amendments to the General Tax Law, Corporate Income Tax Laws, Investment Law, Minerals Law, VAT Law, Import duty exemption law, concerning license transfer tax, royalty, withholding tax, VAT and import duties exemptions.

Select cases of member-based advocacy:

Illegal tax burdens and freezing of accounts

In January, AmCham Mongolia, in collaboration with other chambers, sent an official letter to the Prime Minister urging him to duly enforce some legal provisions (Article 47.3 of the General Law on Taxation) and take the appropriate measures to address illegal tax burdens and the freezing of business accounts.

Chinese-Mongolia border bottlenecks/Logistical issues

AmCham also rigorously followed up on official requests to the Minister of Road and Transportation Development to resolve the bottleneck in the shipment of heavy equipment and spare parts through Tianjin Port to Mongolia's southern border due to the pandemic situation. The situation has gradually improved, but the major risk of delays remains heavily dependent on China's zero-COVID policy.

Barloworld Mongolia

On behalf of Barloworld Mongolia, in April, AmCham Mongolia submitted an official letter to the Deputy Prime Minister urging him to expedite clearing border bottlenecks and customs clearance for 53 billion MNT in heavy equipment, spare parts, and tires stuck at the Erlian and Tianjin ports.

In September, we also submitted an official inquiry to the Prime Minister regarding the debts and arrears owed to private sector companies by SOEs, including Shivee Ovoo and Erdenes Tavan Tolgoi (ETT). In October, Cabinet issued a decree to establish a special regime and working group to investigate ETT-related matters and put the State Secretary of the Ministry of Finance in charge of the company's management. In late October, we received an official response from the Chief of the Cabinet Secretariat, stating the State Property Agency would investigate and resolve the payment of SOE debts. AmCham Mongolia will continue to follow up on these engagements with the government.

Weekly Policy Notes and Policy Updates

AmCham Mongolia continues to develop quality Weekly Policy Notes, reaching over 1,200 subscribers. The WPN provides the latest updates on policy and legislative reforms, an overview of political and economic developments that may impact members, findings from prominent international studies and analyses, and geopolitical perspectives that affect the business environment in Mongolia.

AmCham Mongolia also provided members with timely updates on several emerging policy issues of concern.



AMCHAM EVENTS

In 2022 AmCham Mongolia rolled out full-scale events and hosted numerous events. Throughout the year, we hosted around 30 events in the form of Monthly Meetings, Networking Nights, a virtual session with other AmChams, corporate social responsibility events (tree planting and Mentor Day), innovative social events (Meet & Greet with prominent international guests), and roundtables and forums.






