BADRAKH ENERGY

SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETES ITS FIRST SERIES OF LECTURES AND SEMINARS ON NEW EXTRACTION TECHNOLOGY AT NUM AND MUST





Last March-April, Badrakh Energy and Orano Mining experts organized a series of six lectures and seminars on in-situ recovery technology at domestic universities. Participants included a total of 35 scientists, professors, and students from the National University of Mongolia (NUM) and the Mongolian University of Science and Technology (MUST). The lectures and seminars covered a wide range of topics, including the geological

structure and characteristics of deposits suitable for in-situ recovery, resource estimation, environmental protection during mining, corporate responsibility, public support, and reclamation. As part of the series of lectures and seminars, participants were given a detailed introduction to the entire insitu-leaching mining process, from the pilot production site and processing plant conducted by Badrakh Energy in

2021–2022 to the extracted natural uranium products.

Zuuvch-Ovoo Project Manager Ermal Kopliku noted: "Although small in scale in comparison to future full-scale extraction, our seminar participants were able to see the pilot production facility in person. This allowed them to gain a better understanding and knowledge of ISR (in-situ recovery) technology, its impact, and the foundational principles of future extraction. It was a great pleasure to host guests at the site who are well-versed in the field and approach new developments with an open mind."

The in-situ recovery method is being introduced to Mongolia's mining sector for the first time by Badrakh Energy. For an operator company, it is of vital importance that all project stakeholders have a thorough understanding of in-situ recovery technology to get its "social license" to operate.

The company signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with NUM, MUST, and the Polytechnic College in Sainshand last year in 2023. The initiatives outlined in the MoU are now being realized into concrete actions.



In March 2024, in response to the Mongolian government's initiative to reduce the risks of severe winter conditions (dzud) and to help mitigate the difficulties of spring, Capitron Bank doubled the total donations collected by its employees and contributed the amount to the transparent account of the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA).

"JUNIOR INTERNSHIP PROGRAM 2024"

Capitron Bank served as the main sponsor for the Junior Internship Program (JIP), also known as the "Young Interns" Program, which is implemented by the Zorig Foundation as part of its goal to support youth education.

This program was conducted in April this year and provided 10th and 11th-grade students from secondary schools with the opportunity to explore career paths, participate in personal development training, and engage in short-term internships at organizations in their desired professional fields.

PARTICIPATED IN THE "ONE BILLION TREES" EVENT

In celebration of the 100th anniversary of the establishment and development of Mongolia's banking system, Capitron Bank joined an event in May organized by the Bank of Mongolia, the Mongolian Bankers Association, commercial banks, and the "Billion Trees" fund. During this event, held at the International Eco-Park in Gachuurt, more than 1,000 trees, including pines, larches, and firs, were planted with the participation of Capitron Bank's team.





"STUDENT BANKERS" PROGRAM

Capitron Bank has implemented the "Student bankers" program for the fourth consecutive year, aiming to assist students in taking their first steps into the workforce.

This program provides students with the opportunity to gain practical experience in their field of study, learn about organizational culture, and receive mentorship from industry professionals. Additionally, participants can practice using the software and tools commonly utilized in banking. This year, 10 students were selected to participate in the program, and they completed a three-month paid internship from June onwards, gaining experience in their chosen areas across eight different departments and divisions of the bank.

COLLABORATION WITH "JINJII MINING"

As part of the Mongolian government's action plan, which includes the objective to restore 8,000 hectares of land damaged and neglected due to mining activities, Capitron Bank collaborated with "Jinjii Mining" LLC as the primary financial supporter. This initiative focused on rehabilitating a total of 800 hectares of land in Erdenet, Selenge Province, that had been severely impacted and left unattended for many years due to mining activities.

CHRISTINA NOBLE CHILDREN'S FOUNDATION

As part of our 'Youth Employment' social investment, we have recently become a partner with Christina Noble Children's Foundation (CNCF) supporting its Youth Rehabilitation and Reintegration (YRR) programme in Mongolia.

THE PROBLEM

Mongolia, like many other nations, struggles to offer holistic and effective rehabilitation programmes for young offenders. Inadequate rehabilitation efforts result in young offenders being at risk of relapsing into criminal behaviour due to lack of skills, education, and support. In addition to facing socio-economic challenges such as poverty, unemployment, and limited opportunities, young offenders also encounter stigmatisation and exclusion, including within families and communities, which exacerbates their mental health struggles and the likelihood of reoffending.





THE INTERVENTION

Mongolia, like many other nations, struggles to offer holistic and effective rehabilitation programmes for young offenders. Inadequate rehabilitation efforts result in young offenders being at risk of relapsing into criminal behaviour due to lack of skills, education, and support. In addition to facing socio-economic challenges such as poverty, unemployment, and limited opportunities, young offenders also encounter stigmatisation and exclusion, including within families and communities, which exacerbates their mental health struggles and the likelihood of reoffending.

The intervention

YRR programme addresses the substantial void in providing holistic assistance to young individuals in the criminal justice system. YRR serves male and female juvenile offenders aged between 14-19 years old who live in the detention centre in Ulaanbaatar.

Lorinet Foundation's support marks the initiation of a holistic programme aimed at comprehensively assisting youth in their transition into society and empowering them through skills and education so they may reintegrate back into society with renewed hope in life, which in turn, significantly reduces the country's reoffending rates. The programme is centred on the following goals:

 Education – providing vocational training and extra-curricular activities that are designed to support the social and emotional well-being of the participants as well as equip them with the tools they need to become well-rounded, independent adults.

- Progressive Psychosocial Support –
 providing tailored psychosocial assistance
 and utilising inventive methods such as
 Art Therapy and personalised therapeutic
 sessions to nurture emotional strength and
 overall wellness.
- Strengthening Communities engaging with families and communities, with the goal of countering stigma and establishing a strong support system for youth reintegration.
- Collaborative Partnerships fostering cooperation among governmental entities, civil society groups, international organisations, research institutions, and human rights advocates aimed at achieving effective reintegration.
- Facilitating Sustainable Reintegration

 offering an all-encompassing array
 of services that facilitate a seamless
 reintegration journey for young offenders,
 ultimately deterring any recurrence of
 offending behaviour and individuals
 positively impacting their societies and the
 country.



UNESCO AND RIO TINTO SIGN PARTNERSHIP TO SUPPORT SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT IN MONGOLIA

UNESCO and Rio Tinto have established a comprehensive long-term partnership specifically designed to foster sustainable development initiatives in Mongolia. Within the framework of their partnership, they will implement their first joint project, "Promoting Sustainable Tourism in Mongolia Through UNESCO Cultural and Geo Heritage," a three-year project supported by Rio Tinto Mongolia with a total funding of US\$ 1.5 million. The project will be implemented through the UNESCO Regional Office for East Asia, based in Beijing, China, and a dedicated team in Mongolia.

Focused on promoting sustainable tourism through cultural and geo-

heritage initiatives in Mongolia – home to several UNESCO World Heritage sites and Rio Tinto's Oyu Tolgoi copper project – the project will be implemented through three components: Cultural Heritage Management and Capacity Building, Supporting the Establishment of Geo-parks, and







Knowledge Management and Promotion to Facilitate Scaling Up.

By leveraging the combined expertise and resources of both organisations, this collaboration aims to facilitate the establishment of Mongolia's first UNESCO Global Geopark by supporting geological science. Within the overall partnership, Rio Tinto and UNESCO will collaborate on three key areas:

Sustainable Tourism: Promoting Mongolia's sustainable practices both domestically and internationally and raising awareness about the importance of preserving and celebrating cultural and natural heritage.

Environment and Climate Change: By harnessing their combined expertise, the partners will support better environmental and climate change management practices across Mongolia.

Quality Education: UNESCO and Rio Tinto will work towards ensuring high-quality, equitable, and inclusive Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) programs, building on Rio Tinto's previous investments in the sector. By providing a new generation of Mongolians with specialized technical skills and knowledge, the partners aim to drive sustainable growth and socio-economic progress across the country.
